Moderator's Musing's

In case you had not noticed the heat, humidity, thunderstorms and mosquitos, summer is here! Now is the season for picnics, vacations, and lower church attendance. Yes, when families are away, our churches usually have lower attendance, especially if the pastor is away, as well. Everyone needs a chance to get away and relax. A chance to put the stress of daily life behind you and travel with children and teenagers which provides a level of stress far beyond anything you will face in daily life! Sometimes, coming home can be a vacation, too! Jesus recognized the need for rest and isolation from the daily hustle and bustle. In the Gospels, Jesus called the Disciples away from the crowd to teach, fellowship, and commune with Him. The Disciples also used that time to debate about who should have the most important place in the Kingdom, and to be afraid of the storm, though justifiably so, as the storm was intense. A couple of weeks ago, we were at Busch Gardens, and my daughter and I rode a rollercoaster called the Tempesto. We had ridden the Loch Ness Monster, and Apollo's Chariot, and Tempesto was located next to the Apollo's Chariot entrance. It didn't look to be too bad. We stood in line, and then got on, and it started. We went backwards for a piece, then stopped and were released forward where we raced through the station and through a loop up and down and around! Then we were back. Through most of the ride, we were either airborne (at least above our seat) or experiencing significant g-force and being pushed down into our seat. The ride was short. It was also one of the most intense rides I have ever ridden! I can't imagine what my blood pressure was during the ride, and afterward, I felt a bit drained. But it was FUN! I like rollercoasters, and I will ride that one again. After the day, my stress was mostly gone, and I was tired and relaxed. Jesus didn't take the Disciples on a coaster, but he did take them on a stormy water ride! God gives us the capacity to relax, and we need to do that, so we can come back ready to roll up our sleeves and work in the fields to sow and harvest as He directs. Jesus enjoyed life, and He was a fun person to be around. You can't help but notice His sense of fun as he changes the water into wine, or teaches the Disciples about the eye of the camel, or heals the man born blind, or gathers the children on His lap. Oh that we would be more like Jesus in that way, showing the world that being a Christian is fun. We can even do serious things and still have fun! How great is our God!!

In my last article, I spoke about money, and as I was writing, I was thinking about the book of James and the verse "you have not because you ask not". I want to take a moment, and a little bit of ink, and say thank you to the individuals who have selflessly contributed recently, above and beyond what their churches have given. My prayer is that God will richly bless you through your giving, and that your generous spirit will be an example of unselfish giving for all of us. I appreciate the gifts from our churches, as well. There seems to be a dichotomy in our country today; the stock market is doing great, but most people are not much better off than they were, making it more difficult for our churches to have enough money to fully fund their mission opportunities. Continue to pray with me that we may be good stewards of the resources God provides us, and that we will willingly give, not just our money, but our time, our talents, our spiritual gifts, and ourselves, so that we can make a difference for Christ in our homes, in our churches, in our communities, in our Valley, and in our world!
